We are delighted to share that Queensferry Care successfully applied for a variation to our Care Inspectorate registration to be able to support people at home.

Since Monday 17 August the day care team have been providing a 'Day Care at Home' service. 96% of our current day care members, when asked by the day care team, said they would really value a home visiting service. Day Care at Home provides the same, wide range of activities people would enjoy whilst at The Haven, and we have some new activities too. Day care members are able to choose what happens during our visit, and have been enjoying dominoes, cards, crafts, crosswords, seated exercises, gardening, baking, walks around the local area, or just enjoying the company and having a chat. Day Care at Home also gives family members and carers the opportunity to have a break.

"The ladies who look after me are brilliant. We have a great time and I especially love playing scrabble – more so if I win. I am so pleased and happy that Aileen can come and visit me every week. It makes such a difference. It really cheers me and the budgie up. You can see Peter in the picture, he is such a wee blether, and I love having him to talk to. Peter especially likes eating my crisps, annoying my husband and having a bath."

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Keep up the good work, you and your colleagues are heroes!

This is a new way of working for us, and we will continue to adapt and develop this service together with our day care members and/or their family members.

In times of crisis it is natural for people to want to help and you can help, it is in all of us to be able to make a difference each and every day.
